

How to Use a Mala



Clarify the intention of your practice and choose your intention or affirmation.



Take a few deep breaths to center and observe the speed and depth of your natural breath.



Start with the bead next to the Guru bead.



The Guru bead eventually becomes the last bead of your meditation. Find a quiet space and sit in a comfortable position with back support, if you're new to meditation, with your eves closed.



Bring your focus and attention onto your mantra/intention or affirmation.



Hang the first mala bead gently on the middle or ring finger of your hand. Place your thumb on the guru bead, and use it to count each smaller bead, pulling it with the thumb towards you as you repeat your mantra.



Holding the Guru bead repeat your mantra and use the moment to set your intention.
